HISTORY OF SAA

The Society for AIDS in Africa was founded in 1989 at the fourth International Symposium on AIDS and Associated Cancers in Africa (now ICASA) held in Marseille France by a group of African scientists, activists, and advocates in response to the HIV/AIDS epidemic. The establishment of the Society was the effect of the agitations of some African scientists for the conference to be organized on the African soil. These agitations had begun the previous year (1988) at the third meeting in Arusha, Tanzania. The conference had until then been organized outside the African continent. The cause of these scientists was supported by the then Director of WHO, Peter Piot.

At the 1990 conference held in DR Congo, an executive committee was established to oversee the establishment of the society and to coordinate subsequent ICASA meetings. The society was then officially registered in Nairobi, Kenya.

Founding members of the SAA were: Prof. Mboup from Senegal, Prof. Kaptue from Cameroon, Dr. Sam Okware from Uganda, Prof. Soyinka from Nigeria, Prof. Kadio and Prof. Gershey-Damet from Cote d'Ivoire, Dr. Patrick Kenya and Dr. Owili from Kenya, Dr. M. Pelle from Congo Brazzaville, Dr. Kalenganyi and Dr. Kapita from DR Congo, Prof. Mhalu from Tanzania, Prof. Luo from Zambia, Prof. Latif from Zimbabwe, Dr. Abdulrahman Sow from Mauritania, Dr. Kanki P from USA, Prof. Abdellah Benslimane from Morocco, Dr. Fatia Mohamoud from Sudan and Prof. Ahmed Zribi from Tunisia.

The first election of regional delegates was held in October 1990 in Kinshasa, DR Congo. The selection was done according to the WHO regional classification of sub-Saharan Africa namely, Region 1, Region 2, Region 3 and Emco.

- The first elected representatives of Region 1 were: Prof. Soulemame Mboup from Senegal, Prof. Femi Soyinka from Nigeria, Prof. A. Kadio and Dr. Gershy-Damet from Cote d'Ivoire.
- The elected representatives of Region 2 were: Prof. L. Kaptue from Cameroon, Dr. Dundu Malaki Owili from Kenya, Dr. Pierre Mpelle from Congo Brazzaville and Dr. Karengenyi of the former Zaire (now Democratic Republic of Congo)
- In Region Three, the representatives were: Prof. Fred S. Mhalu from Tanzania, Prof. Nkandu Luo from Zambia and Prof. L. Latif from Zimbabwe.
- In Region 3 (EMCO), the elected representatives were: Prof. Abdellah Benslimane of Morocco who later became the first president of SAA, Dr. Fatia Mohamoud from Sudan and Prof. Ahmed Zribi from Tunisia.

Also involved in the formative process of the society were Prof. K. Kallings from Sweden, Prof. Peter Piot and Dr. Abdulrahman Sow from Geneva, Dr. Patrick Kenya and Dr. N. Angata from Kenya who later became the first Secretary General of SAA.

During the SAA inaugural meeting in Kinshasa, Nairobi was selected as the SAA secretariat headquarters and the society was officially registered there.

At the Morocco meeting in 1993, a unanimous decision of biennially organized ICASA was adopted by the SAA council. ICASAs were held biannually before the Morocco meeting. The first biennial ICASA was thus held in Kampala in 1994 and thereafter in Cote d'Ivoire in 1997, Zambia in 1999, Burkina Faso in 2001, Kenya in 2003, Nigeria in 2005 and Senegal in 2008, Ethiopia in 2011, South Africa in 2013, Zimbabwe in 2015 and Cote d'Ivoire in 2017.

Before relocating to Ghana as the permanent secretariat the SAA moved from Nairobi to Abuja, Nigeria as a functional secretariat. Then on the recommendation the board, on 28th May, 2009, the Society for AIDS in Africa (SAA) relocated the permanent headquarter/secretariat. Operations then commenced in Accra, Ghana.

The Society is registered under the company Act (2019; 992) with registration number CG05032016 and Tax Identification Number (TIN) C0007043759. With the status of an International NGO, SAA is registered under the Department of Social Welfare (DSW/4466).

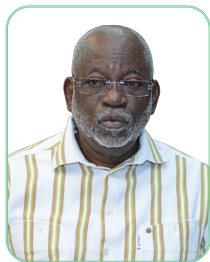

SAA STRATEGIC PLAN (2022 - 2027) - EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- ▶ Society for AIDS in Africa (SAA) is a Pan African non-for-profit organisation founded in 1989 by a group of African Scientists activists and advocates in response to the HIV epidemic. The organisation envisions to end the HIV and AIDS as a pandemic and mitigate the impact of other emerging diseases in Africa.
- ▶ SAA is also dedicated and committed to promoting research on HIV, tuberculosis and malaria and carrying out high level advocacy to fight these diseases and other emerging infections through the strengthening of the health systems in Africa.
- ▶ SAA develops a new strategic plan to help focus on its activities since the most recent SP 2017-2021 with extension 2022 lapsed. This strategic plan provides a detailed strategic direction and its implementation covers the period between 2023 – 2027. The process of developing this strategic plan included setting up a steering committee to provide oversight role and guide the strategic planning process which was carried out in three phases:

- ▶ The review of relevant documents, including workplans, annual reports and reports from ICASA conferences organized within the last 6 years, in addition a (SWOT) analysis of SAA conducted by members of the 2023-2027 Strategic Planning Committee, the members of SAA, the previous and current Board of members, trustees and board of directors, staff and other key stakeholders using a participatory approach.
- ▶ The preparation of the Draft Strategic Plan 2023-2027 using the information gathered in the first phase which was then shared among SAA's members, Board of Directors and key stakeholders for their comments and inputs.
- ▶ The third and final phase was the validation after the feedback received from the draft SP from 2nd phase.

The Goal of SAA is to contribute towards the UNAIDS goal and the AU catalytic framework of achieving the 95-95-95 targets by 2025, ending the AIDS epidemic as a public health threat by 2030 in Africa, contributing to the African Union's Agenda 2063 and facilitating the strengthening of the health systems in Africa towards attaining the Sustainable Development Goals for health.

SAA BOARD EXECUTIVES

Executive board members are elected to serve a four year term, To be eligible, the candidate must:

- ▶ Be a registered and active member of SAA for three (3) consecutive years
- ▶ Have attended at least three past ICASA's.
- ▶ The candidate must have a minimum of 5 years work experience in the field of HIV/AIDS, STIs, Sexual & Reproductive Health or other related issues
- ▶ Elections are conducted electronically and transparently with all active members of SAA, casting their vote for a candidate within their regions.
- ▶ The SAA electorate is grouped into five regions across the African continent: Northern Region, Southern Region, Eastern Region, Western Region and Central Region.
- ▶ Seven (7) presidents elected.

There has been seven(7) consecutive batches of board members and the current board constitute the 7th batch of SAA Board Executives.

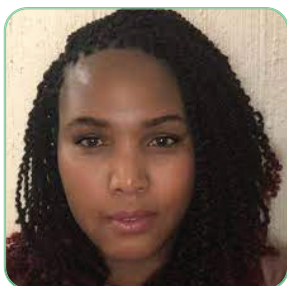

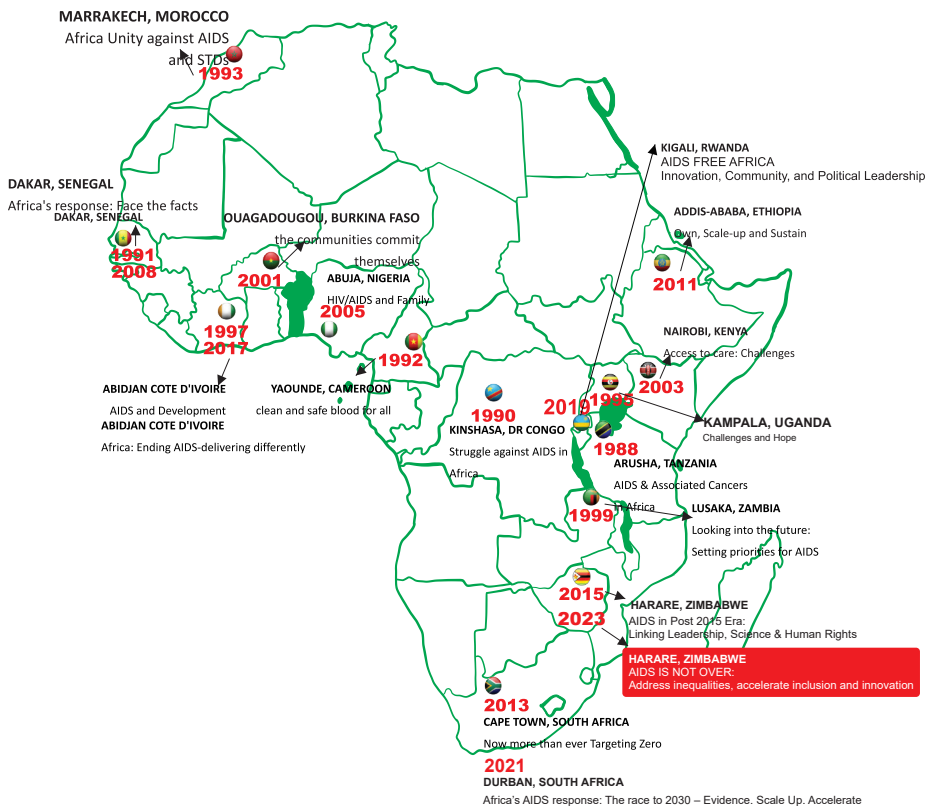

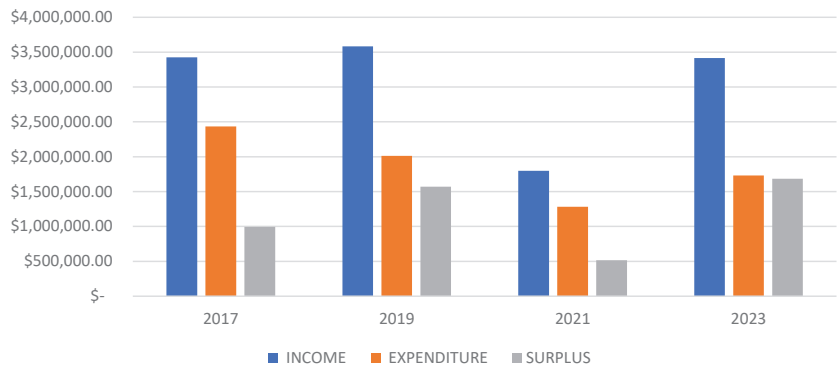
- ▶ We envisage owing an International TV and Radio Station Programme which will aid broadcast activities

- ▶ Office spaces for rent and guests' house.



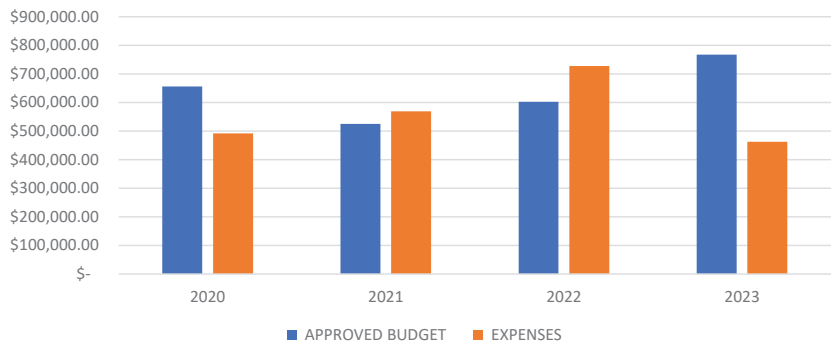
FINANCIAL STATUS OF SAA

8,118 participants from 105 countries attended ICASA 2023 Zimbabwe



Women represented **45%** of delegates



75% of ICASA 2023 plenary speakers were women



ICASA awarded **200** scholarships to attend on-site and **1,571** to attend the conference virtually. **517** scholarships awarded by host country for on-site attendance.



2,600 abstracts were received

95,606 people were reached through social media posts for the duration of the conference

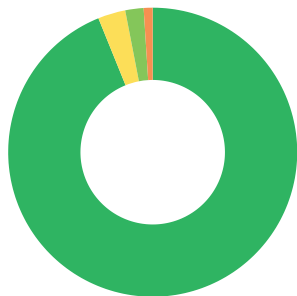
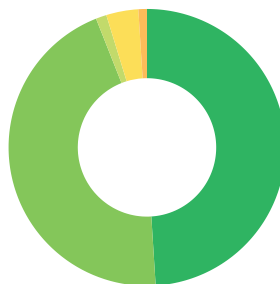
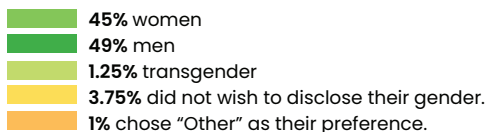

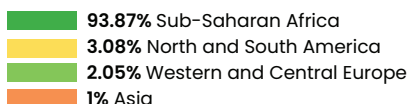

Delegate Attendance

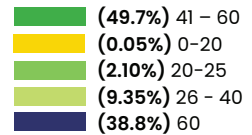
ICASA 2023 convened a total of **8,118** participants from **105** countries. The remaining categories included staff, pre-conference participants, media representatives and in-person exhibitors.

AGE GROUP

Majority of the delegates were between the age ranges of 41 – 60 years (49.7%). Delegates between the ages of 0–20 (0.05%) and 20–25 constituted 2.10%, 26 – 40 years (9.35%) with 38.8% of delegates above 60 years.



Age breakdown (yrs)

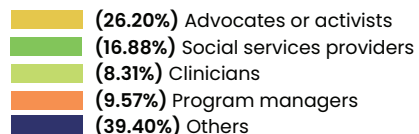


DELEGATES OCCUPATION

In terms of professions, most of the delegates were from the category of advocates or activists (26.20%), health care workers or social services providers (16.88%), clinicians (8.31%), and program managers (9.57%). The researcher community and students constituted 8.56% and 11.84% respectively, showing a drop in participation by researchers (2.58%) and a significant increase for students (6.6%) as compared to the ICASA 2021 South Africa. The data shows a higher response rate from the health care providers and program managers categories as compared to the previous two ICASA conferences where a higher number of delegates were researchers, students, clinicians, and activists.
